



CHÂTEAU LA TOUR CARNET Vintage 2023



Château La Tour Carnet dates back to the 12th century, making it the oldest château in the Médoc. Its architecture is medieval, with a tower built in 1120 and surrounded by a moat. It has had a number of famous owners, including the family of Michel de Montaigne, one of France's greatest philosophers and author of the Essais, who was twice Mayor of Bordeaux. The vineyards of Château La Tour Carnet were planted here in 1409.


