




CHÂTEAU PAPE CLÉMENT VINTAGE 2023



Château Pape Clément is one of the oldest Grands Crus in Bordeaux. Its vineyards were planted in the 13th century by Bertrand de Goth. Archbishop of Bordeaux, he became Pope in 1305, under the name of Clément V. The Château takes its name from this. This estate has been producing wine on the same land since 1252.
